

Post 911 – GI Bill Program *

Students eligible for the Post 911 GI Bill program are eligible for benefits on a percentage scale dependent on the amount of time served in the service, see the VA website for VA determined yearly amounts at www.benefits.va.gov/gibill. The benefit is used to help cover tuition and fees only. The Post 911 tuition and fees benefit as determined by the VA is sent directly to the university. The housing allowance benefit is sent monthly directly to the student.

Federal Title IV Aid will not be deducted from this benefit, scholarships and grants designated for tuition and fees will be deducted. The FRAG from the State of Florida is designated for Tuition and Fees.

In general, Title IV aid (Pell, SEOG, Perkins Loans, Direct Loans and PLUS Loans) will not be affected by VA benefits. A Pell Grant and /or Student Loan recipient will have their federal or state aid that is not designated for tuition and fees applied to room and board or be refunded the difference.

Other state and institutional aid may be applied to room and board when a student resides on campus.

Other Financial Aid designated for Tuition and Fees only will be applied to a student's tuition charges before VA benefits. The remaining tuition and fees charges will be paid by the VA and Yellow Ribbon, if applicable, up to the yearly maximum designated by the VA.

The student should not expect any refund of VA benefits, Tuition Assistance, Webber Scholarships/grants or any other aid source designated for tuition and fees. Students who do not live in on-campus housing may not receive WIU participation scholarship in excess of 10% tuition. Scholarship will be reduced upon verification of housing status, enrollment status and VA benefit status.
