- The Associate degree requires a minimum of 15 semester hours in General Education.
- The Baccalaureate degree requires a minimum of 30 semester hours in General Education.
- All courses must be college-level (no remedial, developmental, or similar courses)
- General Education courses “do not narrowly focus on those skills, techniques, and procedures specific to a student’s particular occupation or profession.”

Each course carries three (3) credits, unless otherwise noted.

The student must take at least one approved General Education course from (a) humanities/fine arts (**H/FA**); (b) social/behavioral science (**S/BS**); and (c) natural science/mathematics (**NS/M**).

At least one course meeting the Humanities requirement must not be basic composition without a literature component; oral communication; or introductory foreign language.
